MISSION

The mission of Cox Mill High School is to graduate all students as empowered problem solvers, continual learners, and productive citizens.

COMMUNITY

Cox Mill High School opened in 2009 and is the newest high school in Cabarrus County. It is located in the high-growth, western portion of the City of Concord in Cabarrus County, NC near Concord Mills Mall, Charlotte Motor Speedway, and the Mecklenburg County line.

CURRICULUM

Cox Mill High School is on a 4x4 block schedule. Students have a variety of curriculum opportunities designed to assist them in meeting graduation requirements, preparing for post-secondary education opportunities, and developing essential skills for the work-place.

A full range of Regular, Honors, and Advanced Placement (AP) courses are offered at Cox Mill High School. A list of advanced course offerings can be found on the back of this profile. Note: Most AP courses are available to 11th and 12th graders only, with a select few available to 10th graders. In addition to the traditional courses taught on-site, students may also participate in distance learning programs such as NC Virtual Public Schools and Rowan-Cabarrus Community College's Career & College Promise Program.

The Academy of Information Technology (AoIT), in conjunction with the NAF organization, bridges the gap between industry and education by providing real world exploration through internships and work-based learning experiences. We offer two tracks of study: computer programming and multimedia webpage design. The AoIT experience will benefit any student, regardless of their career interest, as it will help prepare them for the technology-driven world we live in today. Students apply for this academy program as rising 9th graders.

EXTRACURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

Students in grades 9—12 have opportunities to participate in and enhance their educational experiences via a wide array of extracurricular offerings that include academic, athletic, performing/visual arts, and service-oriented options. All students are strongly encouraged to participate in opportunities which enhance their holistic education. A list of current extracurricular offerings is available on our website.

GPA & GRADING SCALES

GPA SCALE: CMHS calculates both **unweighted** and **weighted** Grade Point Averages (GPA). Honors and Advanced Placement (AP) courses are weighted. Students who **entered HS 2014-15 or before** earn one extra quality point for Honors level and two for AP level classes. Students who **entered HS 2015-16 or after** earn 1/2 extra quality point for Honors level and one for AP level classes.

GRADING SCALE & RANK: Effective 2015-16, courses are graded on a 10-point, numeric scale, though some transcripts may show letter grades from previous schools. Prior to 2015-16, courses were graded on a 7-point scale. Grade Point Average (GPA) is on a weighted 4.0 scale. GPA and class rank is calculated at the conclusion of each semester. Students must have a semester in attendance at Cox Mill High School to be ranked.

GRADUATION

Graduating students must meet the Future Ready Core graduation requirements for the State of North Carolina and local requirements of Cabarrus County Schools. A list of graduation requirements can be found on the back of this profile. Students may earn "honor graduate status" by achieving the appropriate Weighted GPA: Summa Cum Laude (4.320+), Magna Cum Laude (4.0-4.319), and Cum Laude (3.625-3.999). They can also earn designation as a North Carolina Academic Scholar and/or Global Scholar (visit our website for information about these two designations). The current graduation rate at Cox Mill High School is > 95%.

PROFILE—ACADEMIC

CMHS opened in 2009 and is currently in its 11th year of operation. Since opening, CMHS has received the Honors School of Excellence and School of Excellence awards as part of North Carolina's school accountability model, has been ranked a top ten high school in North Carolina (US News and World Report) and recognized in Newsweek as one of America's Top 500 High Schools. The Class of 2020 has approximately 458 seniors with an average weighted GPA of 3.46 and unweighted GPA of 3.22. The SAT Profile for the CMHS Class of 2019 was: Critical Reading=548, Mathematics=540, Combined=1088. The ACT Profile for the CMHS Class of 2019 was English=20.1, Mathematics=21.7, Reading=22.1, Science=21.3, Composite=21.4.

PROFILE—DEMOGRAPHIC

CMHS has approximately 1947 students in grades 9 – 12. Socioeconomic and other types of diversity are represented throughout our student body. Approximately 5% of our students qualify for free/reduced lunch. Ethnically, we average 56% Caucasian, 20% African-American, 8% Hispanic and/or Latino, 5% Multi-Racial, 10% Asian/Pacific Islander, and 1% American Indian. Our typical post-high school plan summary averages: 68% 4-year College, 22% 2-year College, 3% Military, 7% Work.
