### About Our Program

- ✓ All teachers are certified to teach birth through kindergarten.
- ✓ All teacher assistants are highly qualified with early childhood credentials.
- ✓ A 1:6 staff-to-child ratio is maintained at all times.
- ✓ Our program is for children with and without disabilities.
- ✓ Childcare will be available on most teacher workdays.
- ✓ Our school day is 6-6.5 hours per day. Wrap-around care is available at no additional cost.
- ✓ Our hours of operation are from 6:30 am to 5:00 pm.

### Tuition

Tuition is \$125.00 per week, regardless of the child's attendance (part week/part day).

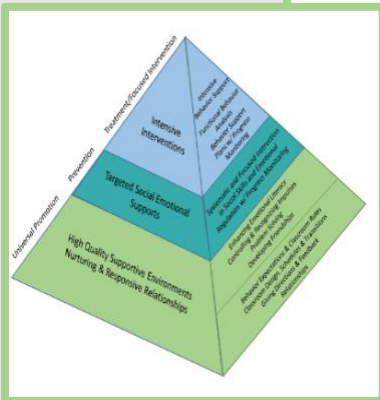


### Enrollment and Registration

- ✓ Enrollment is open to children and grandchildren of Cabarrus County Schools' employees.
- ✓ There is a \$125 nonrefundable registration fee.
- ✓ Applications will be sent via email.
- ✓ A completed application and the registration fee are required to secure placement in the program.
- ✓ Children are eligible to enroll upon their third birthday, based upon availability.

## Creative Curriculum

Our curriculum is based on the project approach to learning. The project approach is an in-depth investigation of a topic. Teachers follow the children's interest when choosing a class project. Children are motivated by their interests and learning is meaningful to them. A project or study incorporates learning through fun, hands on experiences. Skills such as literacy, math, social, and motor skills are all embedded throughout the studies. Children learn higher order thinking skills through experiments and classroom activities.



## SEFEL Pyramid Model

The Mary Frances Wall Center has been implementing the Social Emotional Foundations for Early Learning (SEFEL) pyramid model since 2009 after receiving a grant through the state. The pyramid model is designed to promote positive social and emotional development. The foundation of the model is establishing positive relationships with children and families and creating supportive learning environments. Teachers also focus on strategies to help children express their emotions, regulate their emotions, build friendship skills, and use problem solving skills.
