ENERGIZING EDUCATION IN NORTH CAROLINA

Several years ago North Carolina lawmakers ended a program that had been producing excellent teachers. Some of the state's top high school students received generous scholarships accompanied by ongoing enrichment experiences to ensure the best possible preparation for a career in teaching.

In response to the loss of the Teaching Fellows program, Lenoir-Rhyne University launched its own Teaching Scholars program. The Lenoir-Rhyne University Teaching Scholars program provides scholarships of **\$5,500 per year for four years** to incoming freshmen. These funds are awarded in addition to all other financial aid for which students may already qualify.

The average LR student eligible for this program receives approximately **\$16,000/year** in aid.

LR's Teaching Scholars will be selected on the basis of their potential for academic excellence as a university student and a sincere desire to serve others through a career in teaching.
